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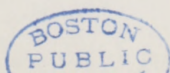

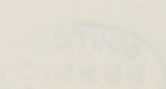

## PREFACE

During the preparation of the BARSTOW—BESTOR GENEALOGY, giving descendants of John<sup>1</sup> and George<sup>1</sup> Barstow, who were brothers of William<sup>1</sup>, information was collected on early Barstows in all three families to make sure that no descendants were omitted from the families of John<sup>1</sup> and George<sup>1</sup>. In correspondence with living members of the Barstow family for information on recent generations, still more data were collected on persons who proved to be descendants of William<sup>1</sup>. The information thus obtained on the family of William<sup>1</sup> Barstow has now been assembled in this book.

Of the many variations in the spelling— or misspelling— of the name Barstow in the early records, the more common ones, such as Basto, Bastow, Bester, and Bestor, were found in various places in records of William's descendants. Only two spellings exist today in this family— Barstow and Bestor. The latter name was adopted by one branch of William's family in Connecticut that lived not too far from descendants of John<sup>1</sup> who also had adopted Bestor as the family name. Whether or not these branches of the two families had any contact with each other is not known. However, some of the sons of Deacon Samuel Barstow of Lebanon, Conn. (No. 28 in this volume) did adopt Bestor as the family name, while others retained the name of Barstow. When the daughters of Deacon Samuel were married and had families of their own, one of them named a son Barstow and another named a son Bester, and Bester appears at least three times as a given name in the next generation. Why these variations in the spelling of the name took place within a single family one can only guess, but it would seem that the spelling of family names, which had been rather loose up to that time, became more firm about the time of the 1790 census when families began to be recorded on a national scale, and better educational opportunities became available.

In his "Historical Sketch of Hanover, Mass.," published in 1853, J. S. Barry gave 35 pages of condensed genealogy of the Barstow family, most of it on the family of William<sup>1</sup>. The dates in Barry's accounts have been checked against town vital records, and where discrepancies were found, the dates in the present volume were made to agree with the official records.

In addition to town, county, and church records, and to cemetery, military, census, probate, and land records, several manuscripts and collections of genealogical notes were consulted. Among these were notes collected by the late Mrs. Elizabeth Barstow Hammand of Des Moines, Iowa, that were loaned to the compiler by her son, Mr. Lowell F. Hammand of Evanston, Illinois. Manuscripts by the Rev. C. N. Sinnett and the Mary Hill Collection were examined in the Maine Historical Society in Portland, as were the Greenlaw Collection and other manuscripts at the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston. For the more recent generations— seventh through tenth— reliance was placed on information supplied by members of the family now living. An effort has been made to give

credit for the source of the information, particularly in the earlier generations, at the point where the information first appears in the genealogy.

Unfortunately, errors have a way of creeping into accounts of this kind, no matter how hard one tries to avoid them. Although we are quick to note the mistakes of others and are loath to admit our own, we must admit the possibility of their occurrence, and the compiler will appreciate having any errors called to his attention.

Thanks are due to the many who answered requests for information on their family lines, and especially to those who went out of their way to write to other members of their immediate families so that their lines would be included. If more had responded to these requests, this genealogy would be more complete than it is.

## BARSTOW

### The Name

The name Barstow (Bearstow, Berestow) is from Old English bear, meaning barley, and stow, a place. According to "A New Dictionary of the English Language," (Oxford, 1888-1928), bear (bær, bere, bar) is the original English word for barley, in later times retained only in the north, especially in Scotland. Similarly, the word barn is from Old English bere-ern (bærn), which became shortened to bern, and finally to the modern word barn, and meant a barley place, or barley storage room.

Stow is an Old English word meaning place of storage or habitation. The word survives in the names of many English towns and villages, as Stow in Hunts, Stowe in Northamptonshire, Stow-on-the-Wold; more frequently as the terminal element, as in Chepstow. New England has Stowe, Vermont, and Plaistow, New Hampshire.

Hence, Barstow means a place for storage of barley, or other grain, and was probably taken as a surname by a man and his family who lived near such a place.

### Origin of the Family

In his "Historical Sketch of Hanover, Mass.," 1853, J.S. Barry wrote, "This family is of English origin, and from the West Riding of Yorkshire." This statement, accepted by many as authentic, has been repeated in several accounts. In the "Earstow-Bestor Genealogy," 1964, this compiler expressed his belief that the Barstow family that came to America in 1635 came from Yorkshire. However, there is doubt concerning the correctness of this conclusion.

A handwritten notebook in the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston (reference no. G-BAR-7380) states by way of introduction, "After the History of the town of Hanover and its inhabitants by Barry was published, opportunity was presented in 1854 to engage the services of Mr. H. G. Somerby (who was about to sail for England for the purpose of making Historical Research) to embrace every opportunity that presented to collect facts relating to the family previous to 1635—that being the time of their arrival in New England. He was fortunate in obtaining extracts from the Prerogation office of the Archbishop of York—and from the Parish Register of Halifax in Yorkshire—Copy of which is hereto annexed.— Providence, Feb. 11th 1864."

Following this statement are abstracts of wills, 1473 to 1634, and extracts from the Parish Register of Halifax. Quoting from Mr. Somerby's report, "The Register begins in 1539, and contains baptisms, marriages, and burials of twenty-three townships, all within the parish of Halifax....The records were apparently kept at first on loose slips of paper, and soon afterwards copied into the present volumes, so that it is very possible some were mislaid and omitted. From the fact that the mothers' names are not given in connection with the baptisms, and from the similarity of the Christian names of the fathers, it is extremely difficult

to trace a perfect pedigree. The entries are in Latin, but I have given translations of all except the first [which reads]

"1538-9 March 'Itm Gilbtus fili<sup>s</sup> Johis Berstow de Halifax  
baptizat fuerent xx<sup>t</sup> die mens einstdm."

Then follow 32 pages of baptisms, etc.

Since William Barstow was born in 1612, and his brother George in 1614, as shown by their ages when they embarked on the Truelove in 1635, and since their brother John was born in 1624 or 1625, as shown by his age at death, this compiler examined the copies made by Mr. Somerby of baptisms in the parish of Halifax, but could not find among them records that would show that these three were brothers and had the same father. Thus, doubt is cast on the presumption that these Barstow brothers came from around Halifax. Mr. Somerby's research, although negative so far as it pertains to the origin of William Barstow, the subject of this volume, does illustrate the difficulty of trying to find family origins in England.

The author of this notebook (and sponsor of Mr. Somerby) did not include his name, but he was probably Mr. John Barstow (1791-1864) of Providence, R. I. (No. 91 in this genealogy; for an account of his life, see the N. E. Hist. Gen. Reg. 18:370-378). A letter, written Nov. 27, 1868 (and now in the possession of Mr. George C. Bestor of Carmel, Calif.), stated, "The late John Barstow, Esq., of Providence, R. I., left an acct. of the family in MS., which has never been printed..." Neither the New England Historic Genealogical Society nor the Rhode Island Historical Society has a manuscript account of the family by John Barstow; the letter must refer to this notebook, or to other papers that did not find their way to a genealogical library.

Other evidence of the origin of the family has been found in the "Topographical Dictionary of 2885 English Emigrants to New England, 1620-1650," by Charles E. Banks, 1937. This book lists George Barstow and William Barstow as emigrants from the parish of Princes Risborough in Buckinghamshire (page 10). The source is the Banks Manuscript in the "Library of C. E. Banks" in the Library of Congress. Others from Buckinghamshire also sailed on the Truelove with the two Barstow brothers: William Preston, his wife and four daughters from Chesham parish (about ten miles from Princes Risborough), and Richard Hawes, his wife and two children from Mussenden Great. Thus, although there were many Barstows in Yorkshire around the year 1600, the evidence obtained by Mr. Banks shows that William Barstow and his brother George came from Buckinghamshire—not Yorkshire.

## FIRST GENERATION

WILLIAM<sup>1</sup> BARSTOW and his brother George came to America on the ship Truelove, which sailed from England, Sept. 20, 1635. Their names were written "Beeresto" on the ship's list of passengers. William's age was given as 23, and George's age as 21, which makes 1612 as the year of William's birth. Michael Barstow, an older brother, and John Barstow, aged 10 in 1635, came to America about the same year, as Michael was in Charlestown, Mass, in 1635. Two sisters, Elizabeth and Susan, also came to America. Elizabeth married William Randall in Scituate, Mass, in 1640, and Susan married William Perry of Marshfield.

The relationship of the four brothers is obtained from Michael's will and other records. Michael made his will on June 23, 1674. He died in 1676, having outlived all of his brothers. His wife had died in 1671, and they left no children. Michael made specific bequests to his pastor John Sherman, to the Church of Christ in Watertown, to his executor Deacon Thomas Hastings, to his overseer Deacon Henry Bright, and to Elizabeth Randall and Susan Perry. He then divided the rest of his estate among his nieces and nephews as follows: Michael, John and Jeremiah Barstow, children of his brother John; the two children of his brother George; and the eight children of his brother William. Although he does not name John as his brother, the fact that John was a brother is confirmed by a court action of 1679, which allowed Lydia Standlake (former daughter-in-law of John) to recover a legacy given to each of her sons "by their Great uncle Micaell Barstow, late of Watertown."

William was in Dedham, Mass, in 1636, where he was one of the original landholders. He was selectman there in 1636 and in 1642. He signed the petition for incorporation of the town, which at the time was known by the name of Contentment. On the 16 d 12 mo 1642, grants of "upland ground fit for improvement with the plough," were made to him and to his brother George.

Several minor incidents involving William are found in the town records of Dedham. At a town meeting on the 18th of October, 1639, the following resolution was passed: "Wheras Will<sup>m</sup> Bearestowe & Will<sup>m</sup> Hudson have felled many trees near unto Mr. Stoughtons Farme Contrary to a order made in yr behalfe. It is agreed that they shal be heard speake the second day of ye next weeke what they can saye for them selves & then all of us goe ye next daye, & view what is done, & to take such order then as ye Case shall require." This matter was disposed of on the 31st day of December, 1639, when "it was ordered Considering their povrty yt they shold only satisfy their forfeit by losing their labor done upon the sayd trees as by the sayd order appeth. And nowe they further peticoning & acknowledging their fault & pleading povrty in ye presents of the wholl assembly...(the selectmen)...doe Remit unto them all the Rayle & posts agayne. Provided yt they paye unto the towne ech of them Ten shillings when they shall Receive their first paye of mr. Stoughton."

On July 14, 1641, Will<sup>m</sup> Bearestowe was one of six men ordered to assist "mr. Jno Oliver measurer in laying out the bounds of this Towne compleate." On July 10, 1642, "Will<sup>m</sup> Bearstowe complayneing of his 8 acre house lott; it was viewed & fownd to be very Defective in the one halfe of the same by a multitude of Stones. Wherefore we order & graunt unto the sayd Will<sup>m</sup> Eight acres of upland betweene the corners of the greate Naponset Swampe about Soustest from our Towne."

William removed to Scituate about 1644 or 1645, and was made a freeman there in 1649. He was one of the first settlers in that part of the town later known as Hanover. He had an orchard on his farm. In the Plymouth Colony Records (volume on "Actions," p. 69) there is noted an action against John Palmer for ten pounds damage "for pulling down fence, and damnifying his apple trees, and for destroying his corn, English and Indian, with his hoggs." In another action William Barstow complained of John Palmer, Sen., and John Palmer, Jr., "for setting of traps and caching of swine, whereby the said Barstow is damnified."

In October 1656, William was authorized to build a bridge across the North River "above the third herring brook, at Stoney Beache, being the place wherr now passengers goe frequently over; the said bridge to be sufficient for horse and foot; and to cleare and mark a way to Hughes cross, and to open and clear and make a way along beyond Hughes Crosse toward the bay, soe as to avoid a certain Rocky hill and swamp: - he to have 12 pounds current cuntry pay for so doing." (Col. Rec. 3:107)

On July 27, 1662, Mr. Barstow agreed with Mr. Constant Southworth and Major Josias Winslow, in behalf of the Colony of New Plymouth, "to keep in repair and maintain the bridge called Barstow's Bridge upon the North River, in consideration of twenty pounds in hand paid, for twenty years, to serve for transportation of passengers, horses, cattle and all such use as they shall ordinarily put it to.. (and pledged for the fulfillment of this contract)...the house and land in and on which he dwelt, a small tract already disposed of to his son Moses Simmons, only excepted." (Col. Rec. 4:76)

In 1657 William was allowed by the Court (Col. Rec. 3:118) to "draw and sell wine, beer, and stronge water for passengers that come and goe over the bridge hee hath lately made, or others that shall have occation, unless any just exception shall come in against him." William had been previously licensed to keep an ordinary (Col. Rec. 4:126) so that it is probable that near his bridge he had a small building as a kind of toll house where he dispensed food and drink.

In 1682 the Colony Court ordered a cart bridge to be built over the North River at Barstow's Bridge at the expense of three towns: Scituate to pay 10 pounds; Duxbury, 5 pounds; and Marshfield, 5 pounds. Barstow's Bridge was used until 1829, when North River Bridge was constructed. The road over Barstow's Bridge became the old Turnpike Road from Boston to Plymouth. In 1829 the Road Commissioners assessed the county for one-quarter of the expense of a stone bridge, which was erected just below the old Barstow Bridge, "the abutments of which can now be seen less than 50 feet

above the North River Bridge." (Briggs' "Shipbuilding on the North River").

By occupation William was a shipwright. He started his shipbuilding business in Hanover in a yard on the North River that he established about 1660. Shipbuilding was continued by his descendants in Hanover and in other towns in Massachusetts and in Maine.

On July 8, 1638, William married in Dedham, Ann Hubbard. She was admitted to the church in Dedham, 16 da 7 mo 1641. William died in 1668, or 1669, leaving no will. His widow Ann was administratrix, and the inventory of his estate was sworn to by her on April 5, 1669. His sons Joseph and William made an agreement in settlement of the estate in June 1669 (Deeds I:97). His widow married John Prince of Hull, Mass, who was born in England about 1610, and whose first wife, Alice Honour, had died in 1668.

## SECOND GENERATION

JOSEPH<sup>2</sup> BARSTOW, son of William (1) and Ann (Hubbard) Barstow, was born in Dedham, Mass, June 6, 1639. He died in Hanover (then Scituate) Mass, April 17, 1712. He married in Hingham, Mass, May 16, 1666, Susanna Lincoln, daughter of Thomas and Margaret (Langer) Lincoln. She died, Jan 31, 1730, being very aged.

Joseph was an extensive landholder. He received many large grants from the Colonial Court, embracing many hundreds of acres now lying partly in Abington and partly in Hanover. These grants were in the vicinity of those made to Cornet Stetson, whose will Joseph Barstow witnessed. In March 1672, liberty was "graunted and allowed to Joseph Barstow to keep an ordinary at the place where he now lives, and that he be provided always with necessaries for the entertainment of travellers, and keep good order in his house, that there be no just cause of complaint against him in that behalfe" (Col. Rec 3:78). The keeper of an "ordinary," or tavern, in the early days of New England was an important and honorable occupation that was quite differently regarded from that of the tavern keeper of late years. One of the most important facilities in a new community was a safe and comfortable place where travellers could stop for food and refreshment, and licenses were granted only to men of character and responsibility.

Joseph's house was on Broadway in Hanover, some distance east of the old William Barstow homestead. In 1674, the Colony began making preparations for the rumored war with King Philip that was expected to break out at any time, and as one of these preparations a garrison of twelve men was ordered, in 1675, to be established in the home of Joseph Barstow. This was the only garrison house that stood in the present town of Hanover, although other garrison houses were fitted out in Scituate. This garrison was in action in the spring of 1676 when the Narragansetts, after ravages in Rhode Island, penetrated even to Plymouth and killed a number of inhabitants of Massachusetts in the course of their march. (For stories of the encounter in which Jeremiah Barstow of the John Barstow family was killed, see Deane's Hist of Scituate and Bliss's Hist of Rehoboth.)

Joseph's will, which is in excellent condition today (1964), was written April 3, 1711, in considerable detail. He mentioned his wife Susannah, his sons Joseph and Samuel, who were named joint executors, his daughter Deborah Briant, his grandsons Issac and Jacob Randall, and his granddaughter Susanna Stetson (PR 1186; Plymouth Co).

WILLIAM<sup>2</sup> BARSTOW, son of William (1) and Ann (Hubbard) Barstow, was born in Hanover, then Scituate, Mass, "in the middle of Sept 1652." His will was made in 1711. He died in Scituate about 1719, the year in which his estate was probated (Plymouth Co PR 1217). He married Sarah, whose surname is unknown.

William and his brother Joseph witnessed the will of Cornet Stetson. Both signed their names as Bearstow. William was a husbandman. He lived in his father's house, and may have engaged in shipbuilding part of the time.

JOSEPH<sup>3</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joseph (2) and Susanna (Lincoln) Barstow, was born in Hanover, then Scituate, Mass, Jan 22, 1675. He died there July 25, 1728, in his 53rd year, and is buried in the Second Church Cemetery in Norwell, Mass. He married Mary Randall, daughter of Job Randall of Scituate, born there Oct 29, 1680.

He was called Capt Joseph in the Hanover records. He and his brothers Benjamin and Samuel represented the Barstows in Hanover when it was established as a separate town. At the first town meeting held June 29, 1727, Joseph was elected moderator. He resided on Broadway, and built the house later known as the Salmond house. In 1720 he and Benjamin Stetson received a grant of two acres of land on the Indian Head River, between Pine Hill and Rocky Run, where they were to locate a forge and refinery, and with three others he erected the forge subsequently known as Barstow's Forge, and which was operated and improved by his descendants for 75 years. It was purchased by the Salmonds when his grandson, Joshua<sup>5</sup> Barstow, removed to Exeter, NH, in 1795.

Joseph's farm consisted of 70 acres; he had other lots of land for a total of 826 acres. His estate was appraised at 6926 pounds, a large sum for those days. Among the items in the inventory were:  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a sloop,  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a grist mill,  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the new forge, and  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a sawmill. He also owned two negro slaves. In the division of his estate, after provision for his widow, his sons James and Joshua each received  $\frac{2}{7}$ , and his three daughters each received  $\frac{1}{7}$  (PR 1187, Plymouth Co; or Book 5:846). His widow married May 14, 1735 (int in Scituate, April 12, 1735) Thomas Bryant, Esq, of Scituate. Her estate was left to her children by her first marriage.

SAMUEL<sup>3</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joseph (2) and Susanna (Lincoln) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, Jan 1, 1683, and died there Oct 23, 1730, aged 47. He married in Scituate, March 17, 1707/8(VR), Lydia Randall, born there Oct 24, 1690(VR), daughter of Job Randall. She married secondly in Hanover, Mass, May 28, 1733, as his second wife, Thomas Tracy, born in Duxbury in 1688, died in Pembroke, Dec 8, 1755. She removed to Pembroke, taking her youngest children with her.

Samuel Barstow resided in the Drinkwater district, and owned land in the central and westerly parts of the town. He was one of the selectmen. He was a wealthy man for his time, and had an estate of nearly 1000 acres. Besides his business of farming he was interested in commercial pursuits as a ship owner, and in manufacturing as proprietor of a mill. His estate was appraised at 3700 pounds. In the division of the estate, his eldest son Samuel received 2/9, the other children each received 1/9, it being the law at that time that the eldest son should have a double share (Plymouth Co PR 1200).

He died sometime before April 6, 1724, the date of administration of his estate (PR 1218). He married in Scituate, Dec 20, 1709 (VR), Sarah Randall, born there Sept 16, 1680, daughter of Joseph and Sarah (Maycumber) Randall. He was called William, Jr., in the records.

On Jan 9, 1728, his widow Sarah was named guardian for her son William, then a minor under 14 years of age (PR 1219). The final distribution of his estate was not made until April 10, 1734. BENJAMIN<sup>3</sup> BARSTOW, son of William (3) and Sarah ( ) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, in that part later to become Hanover, July 22, 1690 (VR). He died in Pembroke, Mass, in 1751 (PR 1148, Plymouth Co). He married first in Scituate, Dec 20, 1709 (VR), Mercy Randall, born there March 16, 1684/5, died in Hanover, Dec 17, 1728, daughter of Joseph and Hannah (Maycumber) Randall. He married secondly, May 15, 1729, Sarah Burden, born in Middleboro, Mass, April 30, 1710 (VR), daughter of Abraham and Mary (Booth) Burden, or Barden. The date of her death has not been found. He did not marry as a third wife Ruth Winslow, as stated by J. S. Barry and by Dwelley and Simmons in their Histories of Hanover. She married his son, Benjamin Barstow, Jr (see iii below).

He lived in the old homestead formerly occupied by his father and grandfather. He was a shipwright, and had the shipyard established by the family on the North River. Several of his sons carried on as shipwrights; his son Thomas in Hanover, George in Maine, James in Duxbury and Pembroke, and Gideon in Mattapoisett.

He married on April 21, 1741 (int in Scituate, Feb 28, 1740), Elizabeth Foster, born in Scituate, Feb 14, 1721, daughter of Hatherly and Bathshua (Turner) Foster (a desc of Elder Wm Brewster).

Joshua was proprietor of the forge built by his father in 1720, and Joshua operated it until his decease. He probably occupied his father's house. All of his children who reached maturity went to Maine except Joshua, who remained in Hanover, and Calvin, who removed to Connecticut.

He married, Nov 26, 1731, Margaret Stockbridge, who was baptized in Scituate, Oct 31, 1708, and died in Hanover, April 12, 1788, aged 80, daughter of Deacon Joseph and Margaret (Turner) Stockbridge, and a descendant of Elder William Brewster.

Samuel was deacon of the First Church for many years. He was selectman of Hanover in 1743 and 1746. He resided on King Street.

JOSEPH<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Samuel (5) and Lydia (Randall) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, in 1725, and was baptized there June 13, 1725. He died in Lebanon, Conn, in 1807. Joseph's father died in 1730 when Joseph was five years old. Joseph removed to Lebanon probably in 1743 when his sister, wife of Ichabod Brewster, went there. Joseph married first in Lebanon, May 6, 1752, Mary (Bliss) Webster, widow of John Webster of Exeter parish, who died May 10, 1750. Her parentage is not known. She died March 4, 1770, and Joseph married secondly Mrs. Sybil Roberts, who was born in 1734. She was admitted to the church in Colchester, Conn, in April 1777, and admitted to the Vernon (Conn) Church on June 16, 1811, on recommendation from the church in Columbia, Conn (Reg 60). An inscription in the old burying ground in Colchester reads, "Mrs. Sybil, relict of Joseph Bester, formerly wife of Benj. Roberts, died Aug 23, 1822, aged 88" (Reg 42).

The service in the Revolution of Joseph Barstow (or Bestor) of Lebanon has been attributed to him in DAR records (DAR 132:37), but it is believed that the service was that of his son Joseph, because the latter's older brothers Job and Michael and his next younger brother Samuel all served in the Revolution. Furthermore,

to support this belief, Joseph's sons, Job, Micah, and Joseph, Jr, are listed in Conn Archives (IIA:22a) for ½ day's training in 1775 as privates from Lebanon (Index Vol).

His will, made Jan 13, 1794, was proved in 1807. He mentioned his sons Samuel, Job, and Micah, his four daughters Molly, Lydia, Betty, and Mehitabel; also the daughter (unnamed) and only heir of his son Joseph, deceased, and his son Charles, to whom he gave nothing (PR Columbia, Conn, 251).

GEORGE<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, and baptized there Jan 10, 1731. He died in Maine about 1770, leaving four sons and four daughters (Hist Ancient Sheepscot and Newcastle, by Cushman, 1882). He married in Pembroke, Mass, Jan 10, 1750/1 (VR) Asenath Taylor, born there Dec 12, 1732, died in Maine after 1820, daughter of Isaac and Jerusha (Tilden) Taylor.

He was a shipbuilder. He lived for a while in Hanover in the residence later occupied by Col John B. Barstow. In 1758 he was living in Duxbury when he, occupation shipwright, was on the bond with his brother Benjamin, occupation yeoman, as guardians of their brother Caleb and their sisters Sarah and Content (PR 1156). He removed about 1765 to Newcastle, Maine, where he purchased the Alexander Little farm. He built ships at the yard afterwards occupied by Benjamin Robinson. His widow lived with her son Benjamin in 1820.

THOMAS<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and his second wife, Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Feb 27, 1732. He died in Scituate, Mass, March 27, 1797, aged 65. He married Sarah<sup>5</sup> Studley, born in Hanover, July 2, 1731, died Feb 2, 1805, aged 74, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Doten) Studley (VR). She was a descendant of Edward Doty (or Doten) of the Mayflower, her line being as follows:

Thomas "was a shipbuilder by trade, as were his ancestors before him, and occupied the yard whose site is marked by two venerable

white oaks" (Barry's Hist Hanover). He resided in Scituate, his farm being near Palmer's bridge by the Third Herring Brook, his house being the one later occupied by his grandson Elijah. All of his children are mentioned in his will (Plymouth PR 1210).

JAMES<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Feb 22, 1734, and died in Duxbury, Mass,

April 1, 1809, aged 75 yr 28 da. He married, Feb 23, 1758, Rhoda House, born in Hanover, Sept 23, 1735, daughter of Joseph and Abigail House. She died in Pembroke, Mass, Sept 5, 1819, aged 83 yr 11 mo 12 da.

He was a shipwright. He resided for a time in Hanover. Later he removed to Duxbury, and engaged in shipbuilding there. He is listed in Duxbury in the 1790 census with four males over 16 and three females in his family. The service of James Barstow (Basto, Berrstow, Bestow) in the Revolution has been attributed to his son James in view of the large family that the subject had in 1775; and also in view of the pension record of his son Joseph, which states that the latter served for one month in 1776 as a substitute for his brother James. James' will, made in July 1808, and its codicil made the following March (Plymouth Co PR 1180) mentions his wife Rhoda; his sons James, Joseph, William, and George; and his two daughters: Abigail, wife of Asa Keen, Jr, and Ruth, wife of William Standish, Jr.

JACOB<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, Feb 15, 1736. He died Aug 27, 1796, aged 61 (Pembroke GR). He was riding on the beach at Brant Rock when his horse threw him into the surf, stepped on his chest, and

killed him instantly.

He married first, March 13, 1760, Kezia (or Desire) Brattles, born in 1740, died in Pembroke, Mass, Sept 28, 1791, in her 52nd year (GR). He married secondly in Pembroke, May 20, 1792, Ruth Lapham, born in 1744, died in Pembroke, Aug 1, 1796, in her 52nd year. He is listed in the 1790 census in Pembroke with two males and three females in his family. His estate, which was administered by his son Charles, gave Jacob's occupation as cordwainer (PR 1177).

His service in the Revolution is found as "Jacob Bestow, Pembroke. Private, Capt Thomas Turner's Co, Col Anthony Thomas' Regt, which marched April 20, 1775, in response to alarm of April 19, 1775, service 3 da"(MSSR II:6). Also as "Jacob Barstow. Pembroke.

Sergeant, Capt John Turner's Co, Col John Cushing's Regt; marched to Rhode Island on the alarm of Dec 9, 1776, service 17 days; also private, Capt Turner's Co, Col Theophilus Cotton's Regt; marched Sept 28, 1777, service 1 mo 3 da at Rhode Island" (MSSR I:706).

The service of Jacob Barstor, private in Capt Partridge's Co in 1779, is believed to be that of his son (MSSR I:705).

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GIDEON<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, in Jan 1738. He died in Mattapoissett, Mass, March 9, 1826, aged 88. He married first in Mattapoissett, Nov 11, 1759, Jane Wilson of Chatham, Mass, born in 1732, died April 1, 1816, aged 84. He married secondly, Oct 28, 1816, Tamar Cushing of Pembroke, who was baptized on April 13, 1766, and died in Hanson, Mass, Feb 10, 1839, aged 73, daughter of Elijah and Anna (Thomas) Cushing. She probably lived with her stepdaughter as she mentioned widow Sarah Barstow and her four children in her will (PR 1209).

Gideon was a shipbuilder. He removed to Mattapoissett about 1760, where he engaged in shipbuilding, already established there

as a thriving industry. His yard at the bend of Main and Water Streets built more than 150 vessels, including the George Lee, the largest ever built in Mattapoissett (Mattapoissett and Old Rochester, by Leonard et al, 1907). His grandsons Zaccheus and Wilson were administrators of his estate (PR 1172).

His service in the Revolution is found under the names of Besto, Bestow, and Bester. He was "Lieutenant, Capt Nathaniel Hammond's Co, Col Ebenezer Sprout's Regt; pay roll for 15 days service (prob in Dec 1776); company marched from Rochester to Rhode Island on an alarm." Also "2nd Lieut, Capt Oliver Allen's Co; 4th Plymouth Co Regt; list of officers of Mass Militia; commissioned May 9, 1776; also 1st Lieut, Capt Nathaniel Hammond's (4th) Co, 4th Plymouth Co Regt; list of officers of Mass Militia (year not given." Also "1st Lieut, Capt Oliver Allen's Co, 4th Plymouth Co Regt; list of officers of Mass Militia, dated Rochester, July 28, 1777; commissioned Aug 16, 1777; reported promoted from 2nd Lieut" (MSSR II:5,6).

CALEB<sup>4</sup> BARSTOW, son of Benjamin (7) and Sarah (Burden) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, in 1739. He died suddenly in East Windsor, Conn, March 17, 1800. A record of his death (VRRRI 13:161) says that he was "formerly of Providence and an ingenious shipwright." He married in Pembroke, Mass, Nov 22, 1770, Sylvina Magoun, born there May 13, 1749, died in Mattapoissett, Mass, in May 1816, aged 67 (died in Providence acc to VRRRI 18:258) daughter of Recompense and Ruth (Crocker) Magoun.

In the Revolution he served first from Duxbury as a "private, Samuel Nelson's Co, Col Aaron Willard's Regt, pay abstract for travel allowance from Duxbury via No. 4 (or Charlestown) to Skeensborough, dated Boston, Jan 1777; also pay abstract for travel allowance from Fort Edward via Albany to Duxbury, allowed in Council, Jan 28, 1777" (MSSR II:5). He also served from Pembroke as a "private, Capt Turner's Co, Col Theophilus Cotton's Regt; marched Sept 28, 1777; service 1 mo 3 da, on an alarm at Rhode Island" (MSSR I:705).

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JAMES<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joshua (8) and Elizabeth (Foster) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Oct 8, 1744; he died in Harpswell, Maine, Feb 20, 1827. Town records of Harpswell show that he registered the earmarks of his cattle there Nov 1, 1766. In the Revolution, James Barsto's name appears on a "receipt for bounty given to selectmen of Harpswell, dated Harpswell, June 8, 1775." Also, James Barstow was on a "list of men who received blankets from selectmen at Harpswell, Aug 12, 1775; joined Capt Curtis' Co, Col Finney's Regt; enlisted July 7, 1779; discharged Sept 25, 1779, service 2 mo 18 da on an expedition to Penobscot. Roll dated Harpswell." (MSSR I:705,706). James Bestow of Harpswell was a "private, Capt James Curtis' Co; muster roll dated Aug 1, 1775; enlisted May 17, 1775; service 3 mo" (MSSR II:6). The three variations in the spelling of his name are typical of the records of the time.

His home on Orrs Island (Harpswell) was for many years a center of cheer and hospitality. He married on Orrs Island, March 19, 1776, Agnes Weir, born in Boston, Mass, in 1748, daughter of William and Lettice Weir (Wyer). Agnes lost her life at the age of 74 when her home burned on Jan 26, 1822. She was the fifth generation from Edward Weir, a tailor, born in Scotland in 1622, died in Charlestown, Mass, May 3, 1693, where he had settled in 1640. Her father William, a laborer, is said to have struck one William Chisholm, a corder, on a wharf in Boston, and Chisholm died shortly thereafter. Weir was tried in Aug 1754, and executed Nov 21, 1754. His widow married Joseph Orr, and moved to Orrs Island (Story of Orrs Island, a pamphlet by Annie H. Thwing, 1925; ms of Rev C. N. Sinnett).

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JOSHUA<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joshua (8) and Elizabeth (Foster) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, June 26 (TR), or July 7 (FR), 1749. He died in Exeter, NH, Dec 22, 1821, aged 73. He married in Pembroke, Mass, Sept 23, 1773, Margaret Bonney, born July 18, 1746 (FR), died in Exeter, Oct 26, 1825, aged 80. Her birth is not given in the published vital records of Pembroke, but from the

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names of her children she was probably the daughter of Ezekiel (son of Joseph and Margaret) and Hannah (Bryant) Bonney of Pembroke.

On April 6, 1772, he and Alexander Soper, a yeoman of Pembroke, were named guardians of Joshua's younger brother Hatherly. Joshua was then of Abington, and was called a refiner (Plymouth Co PR 1175). During the Revolution he served first as a "sergeant, Capt Amos Turner's Co, Col John Bailey's Regt, which marched on alarm of April 19, 1775;" later he was an ensign, then a 2nd lieutenant, and lastly a "1st lieutenant, Artillery Co, 2nd Plymouth Co Regt." (DAR 107:272; MSSR I:707.) He resided in Hanover, and operated the forge known as Barstow's Forge, which manufactured cannon balls for use during the War. He removed to Exeter about 1795. (Some dates in this account are from the Bible of William H.<sup>8</sup> Barstow.)

given in North Preston Congregational Church records as "d \_\_\_\_\_ 1826, aged 80." He married in Preston, Conn, Oct 14, 1773, Margaret Tracy, born there Nov 15, 1751, died there Aug 19, 1807, aged 55 (cem rec), daughter of Jedediah and Jerusha (Richards) Tracy.

He resided in Preston, which was set off from Norwich as a separate town in 1786. He is listed in the 1790 census as Calvin Bestow, New London Co, with 3 males over 16, 1 under 16, and 3 females in his family.

His record of service in the Revolution is found as "Private. Capt Amos Turner's Co, Gen John Thomas' Regt, muster roll dated Aug 1, 1775; enlisted May 3, 1775, service 3 mo 6 da; also order for bounty coat or equivalent, dated Roxbury, Dec 22, 1775" (MSSR I:706). A second record reads "Bastow, Hatherly. Hanover. Private, Capt Turner's Co, Gen Thomas' Regt. Company return (Prob Oct 1775)" (MSSR I:764).

No further record of him has been found.

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TIMOTHY<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joshua (8) and Elizabeth (Foster) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Feb 22, 1762. He died in Portland, Maine, Aug 9, 1837. He settled in Portland where he married (int Nov 18, 1797) Susanna Simonton of Cape Elizabeth, born Sept 30, 1766, died in Portland, March 5, 1848, daughter of Thomas (or Matthew) and Mary ( ) Simonton.

His service in the Revolution is found under the names of Bester and Bestor (MSSR II:5). They read "Private. Capt George Rogers' Co, Col Nathaniel Jordan's Regt, enlisted Sept 23, 1779; disch Oct 23, 1779; service 1 mo at Falmouth," and "Private. Capt Peter Coombes' Co, Lt Col Prince's Regt; enlisted May 23, 1780; disch Jan 25, 1781; service 8 mo 3 da, under command of Brig Gen Wadsworth at the Eastward." He was on the pension roll for Cumberland Co in Sept 1832, at the age of 72, which would indicate that his birth year may have been 1760.

JOSEPH<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joshua (8) and Elizabeth (Foster) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, in 1764, and died in North Yarmouth, Maine, Jan 13, 1844, aged 80. In the "almanac" minutes of Jacob G. Loring there is a note that "Jan 14, Joseph Barstow died last evening." He married first, Sept 3, 1789 (int May 30, 1789) Lydia Prince, who died in North Yarmouth, Sept 28, 1836, daughter of Sylvanus and Elizabeth (Johnson) Prince. In "Old Times in North Yarmouth," it is recorded that the wife of Joseph Barstow was buried Sept 30, 1836.

He married secondly (int in No Yarmouth, May 6, 1837) Mrs Deborah Chase, who died in North Yarmouth, March 10, 1845, aged 83.

He settled in North Yarmouth, where he was a blacksmith and saddler. He was taxed for \$10.03 in 1823.

1759, Huldah House, born in Hanover, Oct 12, 1735, died there Sept 26, 1790, in her 55th year, daughter of Samuel and Deborah (Barstow) House.

He married secondly in Hanover, Jan 15, 1792, Sibyl Hatch, born in 1741, died March 25, 1820, aged 79, daughter of Israel and Bethia (Thomas) Hatch (Pembroke VR).

He resided in Hanover where he was selectman for several terms from 1765 to 1777. At the time of his second marriage he was living in Pembroke. During the Revolution he was a "lieutenant in Capt Robert Lenthall Eels' (South Hanover) Co, which marched April 20, 1775, to Marshfield, in response to alarm of April 19, 1775; service 3 days; under direction of field officers of 2nd Plymouth Co Regt" (MSSR I:707).

Samuel's will, dated Sept 4, 1817, mentioned his wife (who predeceased him), his son Joseph, his daughter Huldah Townsend, the children of his son Joseph, viz, Mary Chase, Anna Chamberlain, Samuel, Job, and Joseph Barstow, and the children of his son Job (deceased), viz, Joseph, Philo, Laura, and Galen Barstow. (PR 1202, Plymouth Co).

He resided in Taunton. (The records of this branch of the family are incomplete as all town records for Taunton were lost by fire in 1838.) During the Revolution he served as a "Private, Sergt Enos Dean's detachment of guards; service 1 day, preventing Highlanders (prisoners) escaping from Taunton jail on the alarm of Dec 8, 1776." He also served from Taunton as "Sergeant, Capt Fales' (Artillery) Co, Col G. Williams' Regt, Gen Godfrey's Brigade;

marched to Slade's ferry in Swansea, RI, on the alarm of Dec 8, 1776; service 26 da; also Capt Josiah Crocker's (Artillery) Co, Brig-Gen Godfrey's Brigade; marched to Tiverton, RI, on the alarm of Aug 2, 1780; service 8 da; endorsed 'Col Mitchell's Regt.'" (MSSR I:705). The service of Charles Barstow, "Private, Capt Samuel Fales' Co, Col J. Daggett's Regt; marched Jan 6, 1778; discharged April 1, 1778; service 2 mo 26 da on an alarm at RI; company drafted to serve under Gen Spencer for 3 mo, from Jan 1, 1778," also probably refers to him (MSSR I:705).

He married in Tisbury, Mass, Dec 1, 1766, Ruth Allen, born Dec 16, 1745 (FR), died in Sharon, Nov 17, 1816, aged 71 (GR).

Seth was in Sharon by about 1770, and is listed in the 1790 census in Litchfield Co, as Seth Bester, with 12 persons in his family. In the 1800 census he is listed in Sharon with five in his family. The "History of Western New York" says that he resided in Martha's Vineyard for a while, then in Mattapoissett before removing to Sharon in 1777. He was a shipwright by trade, but later took up the practice of medicine. All of the children listed below are mentioned in his will (PR 142, State Lib, Hartford). Birth and death dates are from the record of Milo R. Calkins sent by Mrs. J. S. Roberts of New Hartford, NY, and from the Bible of G. H. Barstow.

He married there July 4, 1771, Elizabeth Tilden, born there in 1748, died there March 8, 1826, aged 77, daughter of Lieut Job and Elizabeth (Vinal) Tilden (VR).

He resided on King Street in Hanover. He was described in 1809 by Hon G. H. Barstow (67) as "a gentleman of the old school,

dressed in cocked hat, long blue coat, breeches, and long boots, fastened at the knee by a strap and buckle" (Hist of Hanover, by J. S. Barry). He was selectman in 1786, and captain of one of the old military companies prior to 1800. In his will (Plymouth PR 1159) he mentioned his daughters Betty Rogers, Lucy Stetson, Sally Hatch, and Nabby Stetson, and his son Daniel. He served in the Revolution as a "Private, Capt Hayward Pierce's Co, Col Jeremiah Hall's Regt; marched Dec 10, 1776; service 3 mo 2 da; company raised in Scituate and Hanover to serve at Bristol, RI" (MSSR I:999).

MICHAEL<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joseph (10) and Mary (Bliss)(Webster) Barstow, was born in Lebanon, Conn, May 24, 1754. He died in Haverhill, NH, June 28, 1837, aged 85. He married Ruth Abbott, born in 1753, died in Haverhill, in Sept or Oct 1837, aged 84, only daughter of Capt Abbott of Lebanon Crank, Conn. (Capt Abbott was a shipmaster. He was shot during an engagement while on the deck of his own ship.)

Michael answered the Lexington Alarm in Capt Dan Tilden's Co, which marched April 22, 1775. He left service May 7; service 18 days (Conn Men in Rev, p 15). Micah Barstow, with brothers Job and Joseph, Jr, is listed in Conn Archives (IIA:22a) for ½ day's training in 1775 as a private from Lebanon. He was at the Battle of Bunker Hill in the Regt of Col Trott of Hebron, Conn, and afterwards was at Trenton and Monmouth; also Princeton and White Plains. He was a gunner. He was in the army for six years altogether, including the winter encampment at Valley Forge. He was a pensioner under the Act of 1818 (Conn Men in Rev, p 638).

After his marriage he removed first to Campton, NH, then to Piermont, and then to the neighboring town of Haverhill where his sons were engaged in business. The death record of his son Thomas gives the latter's place of birth as Rindge, NH, so Michael may have lived there in 1792. "At the age of 60 he had not one grey hair. He was exceedingly athletic and nimble; and at the age of 70, stood upon a level piece of graound and sprang upon the back of a wild colt that had never been ridden. At the age of 84 he mowed in the field all the forenoon, with his hired man."

DEACON SAMUEL<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joseph (10) and Mary (Bliss) (Webster) Barstow, was born in Lebanon, Conn, April 8, 1760, and died in Columbia, Conn, Feb 27, 1846, aged 86 (Ch R). He married in Lebanon, Dec 13, 1781, Lucina Wright, born June 10, 1765 (GR), died in Columbia, June 7, 1856, aged 91 (GR).

At the age of 16, he was called into service in the War of the Revolution, and performed three months' duty in 1776 as a soldier in the Army at New York. He was on the pension list of Tolland Co in 1832, and is listed in the 1840 census as a pensioner, aged 80, from Columbia (Conn Men in Rev, pp 656, 664).

He is listed in the 1790 census in Lebanon as Samuel Barton, with himself, one male under 16, and four females in his family. This tally agrees with the record of children given below. He was chosen deacon of the Columbia Church in 1801. During his lifetime he accumulated an estate valued at \$30,000.

His son Randall adopted the family name of Bestor, the earliest occurrence of this spelling of the name in the William Barstow family. One of Randall's sons resumed the name Barstow, but two of them retained the Bestor name and passed it on to descendants living in 1964. The given name of one of the sons of Samuel's daughter Lydia was Barstow, and the given name of one of the sons of his daughter Elvira was Bester. Information on the families in the following accounts was obtained from notes whose authorship is not known that were supplied by Paul R. Barstow (675).

COL GEORGE<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of George (11) and Asenath (Taylor) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, in 1753, and died in Newcastle, Maine, March 17, 1808, aged 55. He married in 1773, Abigail Whitehouse, born in 1755, died in 1853, aged 98.

He served in the Revolution as a "private, Capt Archibald McAllister's Co, Col William Jones' Regt; pay roll for 2 days service retaking mast-ship 'Gruell' and guarding the same, dated Newcastle, Sept 15, 1777" (MSSR I:764). After the Revolution he commenced shipbuilding. He employed a large number of workmen in his yard on the Damariscotta River, and built many vessels for the merchants of Salem. He became colonel of a regiment in Newcastle. (Hist Ancient Sheepscoot and Newcastle, by Cushman, 1882. Acc to VR of Nobleboro he removed from Newcastle\* to Nobleboro and started shipbuilding there with his brother Benjamin.)

BENJAMIN<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of George (11) and Asenath (Taylor) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, in 1756, and baptized in Pembroke, Mass, Sept 17, 1758. He died in Nobleboro, Maine, Aug 20, 1821, aged 65 years. He married in Newcastle, Maine, May 21, 1782, Susannah Hussey, born in 1759, died in Lincoln Co, Maine, April 25, 1839, aged 79 years, daughter of John and Jane (Rollins) Hussey (M. P. Hill Coll, Maine Hist Soc).

He resided in Nobleboro,\* where he was a caulker by occupation. During the Revolution he served as a "Private, Capt George White's Co, Col Benj Tupper's Regt, Continental Army, pay accounts for service from Jan 2, 1777, to Dec 29, 1779, credited to town of Bristol; also pay roll for 81 days ration from date of enlistment Jan 2, 1777, to time of arrival at Bennington; also muster roll for March 1779 dated West Point. Enlistment 3 yr, reported on command at the line" (MSSR I:705). The Nobleboro VR read "Capt Benj, a Rev Sol at Valley Forge." Another service record that may be his reads "Brestow, Benjamin. New Castle. Return of men enlisted into Continental Army from Capt Joseph Jones' Co, 3rd Lincoln Co Regt, dated Nov 7, 1777; residence New Castle, enlisted from town of New Castle; private George White's Co, Col Francis' Regt; enlistment 3 yrs" (MSSR II:85). He was on the pension roll of July 15, 1819, for Lincoln Co; his pension started April 4, 1818, at age 62.

ISAAC<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of George (11) and Asenath (Taylor) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass (prob betw 1758 and 1761), and baptized there Sept 20, 1761. His parents removed to Newcastle, Maine, but he seems to have been at Falmouth, just north of Portland, during the early years of the Revolution. The records of the Isaac Barstow who served in the Revolution at Falmouth undoubtedly refer to him. The first record is that of "Isaac Bisto. Private, Capt William Lithgow's Co; payroll for service from March 1, 1776, to May 31, 1776, 3 mo at Falmouth, Cumberland Co." The second record reads "Isaac Barstow. Private, Capt William Lithgow's Co; payrolls for service from May 31, 1776, to Nov 23, 1776, 5 mo 23 da at Falmouth." The third is "Isaac Basto. Private, Capt Archibald McAllister's Co, Col Samuel McCobb's Regt; enlisted July 11, 1779; roll made up to Sept 24, 1779, service 2 mo 13 da; marched on expedition against Major Bagaduce" (MSSR II:85; I:706,763). The last service was probably at Newcastle, as Isaac's brother George served in Capt Archibald McAllister's Co, which was part of a regiment from Newcastle in Sept 1777.

No records of Isaac's family have been found, but probably he was the father of Isaac<sup>6</sup> Barstow whose son George Ulmer<sup>7</sup> Barstow of Montville, Maine, was born (in Maine) in 1810, and of James<sup>6</sup> Barstow who named one of his sons Isaac. Another child may have been Mary (Polly) Barstow, who married in Montville, Nov 20, 1810, and removed to Ohio, near Zanesville. He is listed in the 1790 census for Newcastle with 1 male over 16, 2 under 16, and 2 females.

THOMAS<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Thomas (12) and Sarah (Studley) Barstow, was born in Scituate, Mass, probably in 1756, baptized there May 22, 1757, and died there Sept 1, 1834, aged 78. He married in Scituate, Nov 22, 1781 (int in Hanover, May 5, 1781) Lydia Sylvester, born in Scituate in 1757, died there Jan 19, 1840 (Hist of Hanover, Barry) daughter of Nathaniel and Sage (Bardin) Sylvester.

Thomas was a "private, Capt Galen Clapp's (2nd) Co, Col Anthony Thomas' Regt, which marched on alarm of April 19, 1775; service 4 days; also Capt William Turner's Co, Col John Bailey's Regt, pay abstract for travel allowance (year not given); company reported to have joined Col Bailey's Regt, Dec 10, 1775." company in which his brother Nathaniel was a fifer (MSSR I:707).

He died in Bristol, Maine, Nov 27, 1798, in his 38th year. He married in Hanover, Mass, Aug 31, 1786, Elizabeth Cushing, born there in 1762, died there Oct 21, 1815, aged 53, daughter of Hon Joseph and Ruth (Stockbridge) Cushing.

Nathaniel was a shipbuilder, and owned a shipyard on the Damariscotta River. He was taxed in Bristol in 1798 for a house and 70 acres of land. His widow was appointed administratrix of his estate, with George Barstow of Newcastle and Benjamin Cushing of Camden as sureties (PR of Lincoln Co, Maine, by W. D. Patterson, 1895). His widow returned to Hanover.

At the age of 14 or 15, Nathaniel was a fifer in Capt Galen Clapp's (2nd) Co, Col Anthony Thomas' Regt, which marched April 22, 1775, in response to alarm of April 19, 1775; service 1 da; also Capt Stetson's Co, Col Thomas' Regt; service from March 24 to March 29, 1776, 5 days; marched from Scituate to Hingham on the alarm at taking of Dorchester Heights; also Lieut Anthony Waterman's Co, Col John Cushing's Regt; marched to Bristol, RI, on the alarm of Dec 10, 1776, service 15 days.

He resided in Hanover on a farm known as "Broad Oak Farm." He entered the shipbuilding business at his father's yard, and after the latter's death in 1797, he was joined by his brother Elijah. They operated the yard until 1817, when they moved to a site farther down the River. This firm built many whaling ships for

Nantucket and New Bedford, and also many merchant ships, among which were five built for the sons of John Barstow who at the time were in business in New York City (Barry's Hist Hanover). John Barstow held the various military ranks of lieutenant, captain, major and colonel. He also served as selectman and representative.

DEACON ELIJAH<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of Thomas (12) and Sarah (Studley) Barstow, was born in 1771, probably in Scituate, Mass, and died June 23, 1842, probably in Pembroke, Mass, where his death is recorded, although the probate record of his estate (Plymouth Co 1166) states that he last resided in Scituate. He married first in Hanover, Mass, Nov 8, 1798, Lucy Eells, born there Aug 12, 1776, died in Scituate, Jan 21, 1840, aged 63, daughter of Capt Robert L. and Ruth (Copeland) Eells. JAMES<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of James (13) and Rhoda (House) Barstow, was born in Pembroke, Mass, and baptized there July 15, 1759. He was killed in Kingston, Mass, during the great gale of Sept 23, 1815, by the fall of a plank from the staging on a ship on which he was at work. He married in Pembroke, Dec 13, 1781, Sarah Leavitt, born there, Dec 28, 1761, died in Rochester, Mass, Oct 16, 1830, aged 69, daughter of John and Ruth (Keen) Leavitt.

He removed from Pembroke to Duxbury with his parents, and his service in the Revolution was from Duxbury. He returned to Pembroke about the time of his marriage, and all of his children were probably born there. He is listed in Pembroke in the 1790 census with one male under 16 and four females in his family besides himself. He was a shipwright.

The records of service in the Revolution of James Barstow (Basto, Beastow, Berrstow, Beston, Bestow) of Duxbury have all been attributed to him, although it is possible that the early service may refer to his father. He is found first as "Private, Capt Benjamin Wadsworth's Co, Col James Warren's (2nd) Regt, which marched on alarm of April 19, 1775" (MSSR II:6). Next as "Private, Capt Joseph Soper's Co, marched July 27, 1775, service 5 mo 18 da, under direction of field officers of 1st Plymouth Co Regt" (MSSR I:706). Thirdly, he was a "Private, Capt Thomas Turner's Co, Col Marshall's Regt, abstract for advance pay, dated Boston, June 7, 1776." This may have been "for service from Aug 1, 1776, to Dec 1, 1776, 4 mo 2 da" (MSSR I:874; II:5). He then appears as a "Private, Capt Hayward Pierce's Co, Col Theophilus Cotton's Regt; enlisted Sept 25, 1777; discharged Oct 28, 1777; service 1 mo 6 da; company drafted from Scituate and Hanover and marched on a secret expedition to Tiverton, RI." James Basto of Duxbury was on a "descriptive list of men enlisted from Plymouth Co for the term of 9 mo from the time of arrival at Fishkill (NY), June 10, 1778; Capt Partridge's Co, Col Cotton's Regt; age 19 yrs, stature 5 ft 5 in, complexion dark, residence Duxbury." Finally we find him as a "corporal, Capt Benj Rider's Co, Col John Jacob's Regt; enlisted July 26, 1780, service 3 mo 9 da on an alarm at Rhode Island; discharged Nov 1, 1780; enlistment 3 mo; company raised to reinforce Continental Army" (MSSR I:706, 763, 999).

JOSEPH<sup>5</sup> BARSTOW, son of James (13) and Rhoda (House) Barstow, was born in Duxbury, Mass, March 12, 1764, and died in Hanson, Mass, July 25, 1835 (VR). He was baptized in Pembroke, April 29, 1764. He married in Duxbury, Nov 16, 1786, Lydia Soule,\* born July 23, 1765, died Jan 31, 1812, daughter of Samuel and Mehitable (White) Soule of Duxbury. He married secondly in Pembroke, Feb 22, 1815, Mrs Deborah (Soper) Damon, who died in Hanson, Jan 25, 1830, aged 61, formerly wife of Elijah Damon, and daughter of Alexander Soper. Joseph enlisted at least twice for service in the Revolution (MSSR I: 706, 707). He served as:

(1) Private. Capt Calvin Curtis' Co, Col John Jacob's Regt, enlisted July 1, 1778; service 6 mo 3 da on an alarm at Rhode Is.

(2) Private. Capt Benjamin Rider's Co, Col John Jacob's Regt, enlisted July 26, 1780, discharged Nov 1, 1780, service 3 mo 9 da on alarm at Rhode Island; company raised to reinforce Continental Army. (Joseph's brother James was a corporal in this company.)

In his application of Aug 22, 1832, for a pension, Joseph claimed the following service:

\*A descendant of George Soule of the Mayflower.

(A) "One month on the Castle, now Fort Independence, in Capt Thomas Turner's Co of militia in, I think, Aug 1776...served as a substitute for his brother James Barstow, who came and took his place, and he returned home sick." This service as a substitute for his older brother was never listed in official records. It should be noted that Joseph was under 13 years of age at the time.

(B) Enlisted again, served 3 mo in Capt Andrew Samson's Co of State Troops in the close of the year 1777 at the Gurnet at the entrance of Plymouth Harbor. Attested to by Josiah Barker.

(C) Enlisted again and served in Capt Josiah Cushing's Co of militia on Nantasket, now Hull, 2 months in the spring of 1778. Attested to by Josiah Barker.

(D) Entered service again last of May or first of June 1778, enlisted in Capt Calvin [Curtis' Co for service in Rhode Island.] Attested to by Josiah Barker and Clement Bates. Bates testified that he was in the same company with Joseph Barstow, that they "marched first to Swanzey and Fall River, Mass, and after being there a short time, marched over Howland's Ferry to Rhode Island, and were stationed part of the time at Butt's Hill repairing the Fort, and then to Middletown nearer Newport, were at Butt's Hill when the August storm came on and were afterward stationed at Little Compton and Slade's Ferry, and after serving six months we were dismissed in December and came home in the snow which was then about knee deep." This deposition confirms the service in item (1) above.

Hatherly Barstow was a shipmaster, and resided in New York (Sinnett ms).

JOB<sup>6</sup> BARSTOW, son of Lieut Samuel (23) and Huldah (House) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Oct 17, 1758, and died in Sharon, Conn, Oct 2, 1790, aged 32. (GR in the Cartwright Burying Ground on Sharon Mtn gives his name as Bestow. Bester and Besto are also found in the records.) Job married Sylvia Loring, baptized in East Bridgewater, Mass, March 20, 1757 (VR), daughter of Capt John and Ruth (Sturtevant) Loring (Loring Gen, by C. H. Pope, 1917; Barry's Hist of Hanover states that Job was unmarried). Seth and Allen Barstow, his uncle and cousin, were named in the probate record of his estate in 1795 (Hartford State Lib). He left a widow Silvea and the four children named below. The 1790 census places him in Litchfield Co, with three males under 16 and two females besides himself in his family. Guardianship papers for his children were signed in 1795.

His widow Silve married secondly in Cornwall, Conn, Jan 29, 1795, Consider Tanner. They had children in Cornwall. Later they removed to Johnston Township, Trumbull Co, Ohio, where Consider Tanner died April 1, 1819, aged 69. The name of Silve's second husband is incorrectly given in the History of Trumbull Co as "Faunce." The correct name of Tanner has been verified by statements of their great-grandchildren, taken in 1929, and by careful examination of the county records. When the two names Tanner and Faunce are written in script, the similarity in appearance is evident and the reason for the error is obvious. Mrs Tanner lived to be 98 years old, and died at the home of her son Joseph Barstow, March 19, 1848 (Hist Trumbull Co; GR in Johnston Cem).

There are several records for the service of Job Barstow in the Revolution. It is believed that the following is his: "Job Barstow. Hanover. Private, Capt Joseph Soper's (No Hanover) Co, 2nd Plymouth Co Regt, which marched April 20, 1775, to Marshfield; service 3 da." This is the same march taken by his father in a different company. The record continues, "also Capt Wm Turner's Co, Col John Bailey's Regt; pay abstract for travel allowance (year not given); company reported to have joined Col Bailey's Regt, Dec 10, 1775; also Capt Lemuel Curtis' Co, Col Anthony Thomas (Plymouth Co) Regt; service from March 5 to March 9, 1776, 4 da, marched to Cohasset on alarm" (MSSR I:706). Under Job Bestow is found this record (MSSR II:6): "Private. Capt Joseph Clift's Co, Col Josiah Whitney's (Plymouth Co) Regt; marched to RI, July 29, 1778; disch Sept 13, 1778, service 1 mo 19 da." (The DAR record ((50:140)) is incorrect in attributing this service, or part of it, to Job Barstow of Canterbury, Conn. That Job Barstow, born in 1761 and a descendant of John<sup>1</sup> Barstow, did, however, see service from Conn.) After Job removed to Litchfield Co, Conn, he undoubtedly saw further service as Job Bester, one of the levies in the 8th Conn Regt, Col John Chandler; served from July 8, 1780, to Dec 16, 1780, being with the main army on the Hudson (Conn Men in Rev, p 239).

Job's four children were mentioned in the will of their grandfather, written in Hanover, Sept 4, 1817, and presumably all were living at that time (Plymouth Co PR 1202, proved in 1826).

He died in Canaan, NY, Feb 5, 1854. He married in Sharon, Conn, in 1794, Olive Foster, born there Jan 11, 1769, daughter of Elijah and Deborah (Holly) Foster.

Allen Barstow removed from eastern Massachusetts to Sharon, Conn, as a young boy. Sometime after his marriage he removed to Canaan, NY, where the first purchase of land was made by him in 1825. His will of 1842, with codicil of 1849, was probated June 7, 1854 (Columbia Co PR L-265). He mentioned his wife Olive,

his sons David F. and Samuel A. (his executor), his grandsons Allen, Henry B., Samuel, Daniel B., David, and Charles Douglas, his granddaughters Caroline F., Elizabeth C., and Olive, and his great-grandson William H. Green, son of Caroline F., who died in 1849.

He married in West Stockbridge, Mass, Nov 11, 1801 (Pittsfield Sun), Lavina Wilcox of Alford, Mass, who died in Nichols, NY, about 1843.

He studied medicine, and settled first in West Stockbridge. He was state representative for the town in 1808. He removed to Great Barrington about 1809. He was state senator in 1812.

He married in Orwell, Penna (the first marriage recorded there), June 4, 1806, Clarissa Woodruff, born in Litchfield, Conn, in 1786, died in Wysox, Penna, March 14, 1853, aged 67, daughter of Samuel Woodruff. She started teaching school in a log cabin in Orwell in 1803.

He studied medicine under Dr. Rush of Philadelphia, and was graduated from the Philadelphia Medical College. He settled in

Wysox, Penna, in 1810. After a short period of practice he turned to trading and farming. He opened a store, became a large land owner, and operated a saw mill and a distillery (Hist Bradford Co, by C.F. Heverly, 1913).

GAMALIEL H.<sup>6</sup> BARSTOW, son of Seth (25) and Ruth (Allen) Barstow, was born in Sharon, Conn, July 20, 1784, and baptized there Aug 2, 1784. He resided with his parents until he was 25, working on the farm in summer and teaching school in winter. In 1809 he went to Great Barrington, Mass, to study medicine with his brother Samuel. In 1812 he settled in Tioga Co, NY, where he practiced until 1823. He then turned to trading and farming and got into politics. He built a distillery which he operated for a while but soon abandoned. He also engaged in the manufacture of potash, and erected a small building for this purpose. He was a member of the NY State Assembly from 1815 to 1819; First Judge of Tioga Co in 1818, serving until 1823; State Senator, 1819-22; State Treasurer, 1825-28, also in 1838; supervisor of Nichols, 1830; and member of Congress. (Hist Gaz of Tioga Co, by W.B. Gay, 1887-8; Mem Hist Tioga Co, by L.W. Kingman, 1897; Bible rec, DAR Lib, Washington.)

CAPT EDWARD<sup>6</sup> BARSTOW, son of Col John B. (35) and Betsey (Ells) Barstow, was born in Hanover, Mass, Aug 27, 1795. He died Jan 27, 1833, aged 37 (Hanover rec). He married in Hanover, Sept 2, 1821, Amy Bailey, daughter of John Bailey, a Quaker preacher and clock maker, and his wife Mary (Hill) Bailey. Amy married secondly in Hanover, Aug 18, 1846, Capt William Dawes of Taunton, a widower, and son of Rev Ebenezer Dawes of Scituate.

Capt Barstow was a shipmaster for some years prior to his death, and sailed from New York.

The story of the house in which he lived in Hanover is told by Dwelley and Simmons in their History of Hanover, p 248 (1910), as follows:

"The two-story house on Washington St near the end of Oakland Ave was probably built about 1773, by Robert Sylvester. There is little doubt that this supplanted a much older house, probably built very early by the first William Barstow, or one of his sons. After Robert Sylvester's death, about 1798, the house was owned and occupied by John Bailey, the Quaker preacher and clock maker. After his death it was occupied by his son John, a Quaker and a watch and clock maker...

"Capt Edward Barstow married Amy, the Quaker preacher's daughter, and lived here, and after his death she married Capt William Dawes...who lived here many years...

"Capt Edward Barstow, a son of the Capt Edward above named, lived here many years, and the house is still owned (1910) and occupied by his family."

The second Capt Edward's widow died in 1913, three years after the History was published, and his daughter Georgie continued to

live in the house until her death in 1960.

JOSEPH<sup>7</sup> BARSTOW, son of Job (61) and Silvia (loring) Barstow, was born in Sharon, Conn, Oct 2, 1781 (VR), and died in Harrison (now Platteville), Wisconsin, Feb 7, 1870, aged 88 (Lancaster, Wis., Herald, Feb 22, 1870). He married Betsey Gray (date not found), born in Sharon in 1787, died in Platteville in 1864, aged 77, daughter of Darius and Abigail (Ashley) Gray (Hist Trumbull Co, Ohio; Gray Gen, by M. D. Raymond, 1887).

He removed to Norway, Herkimer Co, NY, where he purchased land, April 20, 1811, from Asa and Elizabeth Matteson of Fairfield, NY (Herkimer Co LR 7:375). In 1816, Joseph and his wife Betsey, then of nearby Salisbury, Montgomery Co, NY, sold their land in Norway to Simeon Ives (LR 12:619). About that time, or shortly thereafter, he removed to Johnston Township, Trumbull Co, Ohio, where he was one of the early settlers. He may have lived for a short time in Vernon, Ohio. About 1844 he removed to Platteville, Wis.

Joseph was an expert mechanic and blacksmith. He started a general smith shop with his son Wallace where they made plows. He was a leader in community affairs, but would not accept public office. He read widely, and was well advised on "natural and world happenings." He was politically an Abolitionist, Whig, and Republican. He and his children and grandchildren were all musical, could sing well and play many different instruments. The 1820 census for Johnston Twp shows two males and one female up to 10 years old, one male and one female, ages 10-16, besides his wife and himself in his family.

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GALEN<sup>7</sup> BARSTOW, son of Job (61) and Sylvia (Loring) Barstow, was born in Sharon, Conn, in April 1789. Galen's father died the following year, and Galen became the ward of his uncle Seth, who also lived in Sharon (PR of guardianship). Galen married, April 20, 1814, Almira Leadbetter of Richmond, Mass (1st Presb Ch rec, Albany, in Early Settlers of NY State 4:115). She was bap in Richmond, June 24, 1804, daughter of Thomas and Anna (Rowley) Leadbetter (VR).

Galen removed to Norway in Herkimer Co, NY, where he bought land on April 22, 1815, from Josiah Smith and his wife Polly (LR 9:1).

Galen and his wife Almira sold this land , Dec 23, 1820, to Charles Bradley of Norway (LR 13:616). Galen bought land in Oneida Co (LR 51:400, recorded in 1830), but it is not known if he ever lived there. He removed to Morris, Ill, where he died. (The record by V. H. Young in 1928 says that he married Harriet, possibly a second wife.)

After he removed to Illinois, Galen and his brother Joseph did not see each other for 42 years. They were brought together after the Civil War when Joseph went to Morris, Ill, to visit Galen whose whereabouts had become known by Joseph's granddaughter, Adaline Young, through correspondence with a soldier.

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JOB<sup>7</sup> BARSTOW, son of Joseph (62) and Mary (Hatch) Barstow, was born in Pembroke, Mass, May 19, 1790. Nothing further is found about him there, except the fact that his grandfather, Samuel Barstow (23), mentioned his grandson Job, son of Joseph, in his will, which was written in 1817 and probated in 1826 (Plymouth Co PR 1202). Samuel did say that if the children of his son Joseph did not appear to claim their inheritance their share was to go other heirs of Samuel.

Samuel's will shows that Job was living in 1817. However, he was not living in Massachusetts then, as he had removed with his father to Cornish, NH, probably about the time of his father's second marriage in Cornish in 1801. Later Job removed to Franklin Co, NY, where he married Rebecca and had his family. This is clear from marriage and death records of his sons in Wisconsin. These records sometimes give Job's name as Job and sometimes as Joe or Jacob, but all give his wife's name as Rebecca, and state that Job was born in Mass, and that Rebecca was born in Canada. These records seem adequate to establish the fact that the Job Barstow, Sr, who was in Sauk Co, Wis, in the middle 1800's was the Job Barstow who was born in Mass in 1790. There was no other Job who was born in Massachusetts around that time who could be rearing a family in the 1820's and 1830's.

The next record of Job is found in the Wisconsin Territorial census of Dec 1, 1847, which shows him in the Baraboo precinct of

Sauk Co, where he is listed as Job Barstow, Sr, with 7 white males and 4 white females in his family. It seems probable that this is the same person as the one listed in the Sauk Co census for June 1, 1846, Baraboo precinct, as Job Barto with 9 white males and 4 white females in his family. If so, the loss of at least one male can be accounted for by the marriage of his son Job in Sept 1846, as the latter appeared separately in the 1847 census.

The settlers in the Baraboo Valley organized what was known as the "Claimants Association" on Sept 7, 1846. Job Barstow, Sr, and Job Barstow, Jr, were members (Hist Sauk Co, 1880, p 502).

The Old Settlers Association, which was formed about 1872, had Job Barstow of Greenfield as a member. This may have been the son.

A Job Barstow died in Kingsbury, SD, in 1884. This is believed to be Job, Sr, who would have been 94 years old at the time, but may have been the son.

He and his father were members of the Baraboo Claimants' Association, organized in Sauk Co, Sept 7, 1846 (Hist Sauk Co, p 502). He is listed in the Territorial census of Dec 1, 1847, in the Baraboo precinct, as Job Barstow, Jr, with 2 males and 1 female in his family. In that year he operated the Hoover tavern that was owned by his wife's father (Hist Sauk Co, p 498). He resided in Greenfield, Wis, in the 1870's. The Old Settlers Association, formed about 1872, elected Job Barstow of Greenfield as vice president in 1873, and later elected him as treasurer.

ALBERT<sup>8</sup> BARSTOW, believed to be the son of Job (151) and Rebecca Barstow, was born about 1830, probably in New York State. One record lists him as the son of Job Barstow of Kingsbury, SD, and states that he was born in Mass in 1830 (E.S.B. notes, 1929). Another record gives his birthplace as Vermont in 1831 (Dr G. Ward Barstow, Bradshaw, Md, 1957). It is believed that both of these records contain errors. The birth in Mass relates to Albert's father; the birth in Vermont may relate to his father's one-time residence in Cornish, NH, which is across the Conn River from Vermont, and may indicate that he lived for a while in Vermont. The important facts in these and other records are: (a) Albert is related to a Job Barstow of South Dakota (b) Albert named his oldest child Rebecca (c) Albert is also the given name of the son of Job Barstow, Jr (265). These facts seem sufficient to place him in the family of Job Barstow, who was born in Mass, removed to Cornish, NH, and later to Franklin Co, NY, where he married Rebecca.

The 23 of june 1674.

I, Michael Barstow (of Watertowne in the County of Middlesex within the Collyeny of the Massachusetts in New England) beinge at present, though weake in body, yett of sound mind & memory praised be God for itt; renouncinge & makinge void all former wills; doe make and declare this my last will and testamnet; my Soule I freely and willingly comit into the hand of God my Creator; my body unto the earth; at the charge of my Exicutor, hear after named; by Christian buriall in assured hope of A joyfull resurrection through the purchase of Christ my redeemer; and for my outward estate that God have lent mee, I will and dispose of itt in manner as ffolloweth.

I will and bequeath to my Dear pastor mr. John Sherman pastor of the church in watertowne, my ffearm lyinge & beinge in watertowne: and granted unto mee by the inhabitants of the sayd towne: to him and his heyeres forever: and is accounted the 40 lott in the land known by the name of ffarme land

Item I give to Hannah Barstow alias prince one great bible, and ye debt due to mee in my booke, which her first husband William Barstow was indebted to me in my booke.

Item I give to y<sup>e</sup> Church of Christ in Watertowne sixteene pounds to be paid in cash within one year after my decease

Item I give to Elizabeth Randall the wife of William Randall (of Sittuate in plymoth Colony) five pounds to be paid in cash within one year after my decease.

Item I give to Susan Perry the wife of William perry (in marshfield collyeny) five pound to be paid in cash within one year after my decease

Item I give to michaell Barstow (the sonn of John Barstow deceased, to him and his heires forever) my lott of upland & meddow, lyinge & being in watertowne near the dwellinge house of John Traine, bounded South and west with the high way north and east with lands of Joseph Tainter, and Edmand Bloyse, and also I give him my lott att bare-hill, lyinge in Watertowne, and known by the name of land in the leiuie of township.

Item I give to John & Jerimiah Barstow, the children of the aforesaid John Barstow deceased, to each of them fiveteene pounds apeice to be paid in cash within one year after my decease

Item I give Deacon Thomas Hastings of Watertowne, tenn pound to be paid in cash within one year after my decease

Item I give to Deacon Henry Bright of Watertowne, fforty shillings to be paid in cash within one year after my decease.

Item my will is that the rest of my estate, houseinge, lands, household goods, bills, bonds, chattills and debts, the whole & singular reall and parsonall of what kind soever (debts & ffunerall


charges being first discharged) be equally divided into ten parts or shares, two of which parts or shares, I give unto the children of my Brother George Barstow deceased, and eight of the said shares I give to the children of my Brother William Barstow deceased, that is to each child a single share of ten shares or parts

Item I do nominate, appoint and fully authorize the aforesaid Deacon Thomas Hastings, my sole executor desiring him to perform this my last Will according to the true intent & purpose of it

Item my Will is that, Deacon Henry Bright aforesaid be overseer of this my last will and testament. In confirmation of this aforesaid to be my last Will, I Michael Barstow, have hereunto put my hand and seal the day above written

## APPENDIX B

### Unconnected Barstow Families

During the preparation of this genealogy, records were collected of many persons and family groups bearing the name Barstow that could not be placed in any of the families whose lines are given in the preceding pages.

As the Barstow lines in the John<sup>1</sup> Barstow family are reasonably complete, and those in the George<sup>1</sup> Barstow family had by 1800 adopted Beairsto or Basto as the family name,\* it was felt that these miscellaneous Barstows were most probably members of the William<sup>1</sup> Barstow family if they were related to any of the original immigrant Barstows.

Records of several of these unconnected Barstow families are given in this appendix. It is hoped that further research will uncover data that will establish the relationship of these persons to other known lines.

SAMUEL BARSTOW, a native of Maine, was born about 1800. His father worked as a carpenter in Maine seacoast towns. Samuel was a carpenter, and was on the high seas for six years as a ship carpenter. Samuel married first in Muskingum Co, Ohio, Nov 1, 1821 Elvira (Alvira) Woodruff, a native of Ohio. She died May 5, 1840. He married secondly in Ohio, Mary L. Jett, a native of Virginia. She died in Farmington, Illinois, in 1889. Samuel died there on Dec 22, 1866. He and his wife Mary sold their land in Zanesville, Dec 30, 1854, and presumably removed to Illinois at that time. The deed was witnessed by Willis Barstow. (Biog Hist Pottawattamie Co, Iowa, 1891; Muskingum Co Mar Rec; Deeds 28:91).
